Grand Christmas Post Day: Today is the day that children can bring their Christmas cards to school for their friends if they wish.

Parents welcome to come along to Booths for 11.15am. Please ensure the permission slip is sent back to school (letter sent home Tuesday 10th December). If we

Medical:

Firstly, it is parent's responsibility to ensure that your child is well enough to come in to school.

If your child is sick or has an accident in school, we will need to contact you. To enable us to keep contact addresses and telephone numbers up to date, please notify the school ASAP of ANY changes.

The Health Protection Agency has drawn up the following list of minimal isolation periods, but in severe cases, longer periods may be recommended by your GP and school will need to be notified of this. As a school we refer to the document below.

Disease	Period of Exclusion
Chickenpox	At least 5 days from onset of rash and until all blisters have crusted over.
Conjunctivitis	Consult your local pharmacy before attending school.
Flu	Until recovered.
German Measles (Rubella)	5 days from onset of rash.
Head Lice	A common problem in school, please check your child's hair regularly and treat the whole family as necessary. Pupils may attend school once treated.
Impetigo	Until skin has dried and healed and there are no open sores or 48 hours after commencing antibiotics.
Measles	4 days from onset of rash.
Mumps	5 days after onset of swelling.
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after commencing antibiotics.
Sickness or diarrhoea	48 hours from the last episode.
Slapped cheek	No need for absence once rash has developed.
Threadworm	Consult your local pharmacy before attending school.
Tonsillitis	Until recovered from virus.
Whooping Cough (Pertussis)	2 days from commencing antibiotics or 21 days from onset of illness if no antibiotic treatment.

Parent Whats App Groups:

Just for clarity: Parent WhatsApp groups are not endorsed by school and they operate independently of the school. The messages in these WhatsApp groups come from parents in their personal capacity. The school does not post directly on any Class WhatsApp parent group nor do we have any 'parent advocates' who post messages on our behalf, any messages I need to give will be in the newsletter or an e-mail direct from school. It is always best to seek clarification direct from school regarding anything school related as this can be addressed quickly and far more accurately.

Reminder – No dogs on the playground:

Dogs are an important part of family life for many in the school community and as such are often included in day-to day activities such as walking children to and from school. However, some children and adults do find the presence of dogs stressful, sometimes frightening, particularly with younger children. As part of our Health and Safety, dogs are **NOT** permitted onto the school playground (either on a lead or carried). Thank you for your understanding.
